About the Role

- Organize and coordinate community meetings, information sessions, and site visits
- Ensure community concerns and questions are addressed in a respectful and timely manner
- Track and support implementation of Project commitments following the FNNND Mining Policy
- Support employment, training, and contracting opportunities for FNNND citizens
- Coordinate cultural awareness training for Banyan staff and contractors
- Prepare community updates, newsletters, and engagement materials
- Work closely with Environmental, Project Development, and Executive teams to ensure alignment between project activities and community expectations

- Experience in community engagement, communications, Indigenous relations, or related field
